Hello Lake District Residents!

It's that time of year again when all the preparations are happening for the summer lake season to begin! This includes inviting you to attend the ELMD Annual Meeting. The meeting provides attendees with lots of current lake information. Verified Lake District property owners will vote on the proposed budget and assessment as well as vote in the election of one Commissioner. This year the term for Tom Regan, Treasurer, expires. Let me highlight some Lake District business and activity. Troy McReynolds is our new Racine County appointee and been participating on the ELMD Board since last summer. Troy is also the current County Supervisor for our area (District 18). Welcome Troy!

There was a fish stocking event back in August. Five hundred fifty (550) extended growth Northern Pike were purchased and delivered to their new home in Eagle Lake. Because of reductions in the DNR fish stocking budget, the ELMD plans to continue stocking walleye every other year and other predator fish during the in-between years. The April 2025 walleye survey showed very positive results.

Survey work and the new Aquatic Plant Management Plan was recently completed and accepted by the DNR. The plan can be found on the Lake District website. This plan allows us to apply for the annual chemical treatments that are planned for sometime in May.

Volunteers continue to dedicate precious time and make valuable contributions to the lake. The two programs receiving DNR grant funding are Clean Boats Clean Waters (Jill Frey) and Citizens Lake Monitoring Network (Keith Potts). Next, we have the newly formed Eagle Lake Restoration Committee (Dave Aldridge). This Committee is focused on taking a deeper dive into researching and understanding realistic options to improve water quality for Eagle Lake. Last but not least, we have volunteers that help run our harvesters. These efforts greatly improve early season navigation, reduce invasive weed growth and ultimately help with lowering phosphorus levels by removing decaying matter. ELMD will again be employing students to work on the ever popular Eagle Lake weed crew. You will see them hard at work beginning in early June.

This year's proposed annual budget is for a \$525 assessment, same as last year. In working through recent budget preparations, the ELMD board senses the probability of assessment increases in coming years. Year-end financials are currently being reviewed and certified by the CPA and will be posted on the website and discussed at the Annual Meeting.

Speaking of the Annual Meeting, please arrive early so everyone can be checked in and the meeting begins on time. Lake District meetings are open to the public, however, only verified Lake District property owners are allowed to vote and make motions during the meeting.

In closing, I want to remind everyone about the ordinance the Town approved last summer prohibiting enhanced wake on Eagle Lake. The complete ordinance is posted on the ELMD website. I suggest following the ELMD Facebook page or periodically checking the website. Both sources are a great way for receiving current news, meeting agendas, board meeting minutes and updates on lake conditions, weed treatments and weed harvesting.
